- 5. Carefully take off the hubcap. Put it somewhere safe so it doesn't roll away.
- 6. Remove the lug nuts and put them in a safe place. Then take off the flat tire.
- 7. Put the spare tire on the car. Put the lug nuts back on, but don't tighten them yet.
- 8. Lower the car until the spare tire touches the ground. But don't lower it all the way.
- 9. Tighten the lug nuts as much as you can.
- 10. Jack up the car again. Remove the jack and lower the car to the ground.
- 11. Tighten the lug nuts one more time. Make sure they are very tight.
- 12. Put the flat tire, the jack, and the lug wrench back in the trunk. You're finished!

Now you can drive your car again. But be careful! The spare tire is only for emergencies. It is not as good as a regular tire. Go to a service station as soon as possible and get a new tire.
