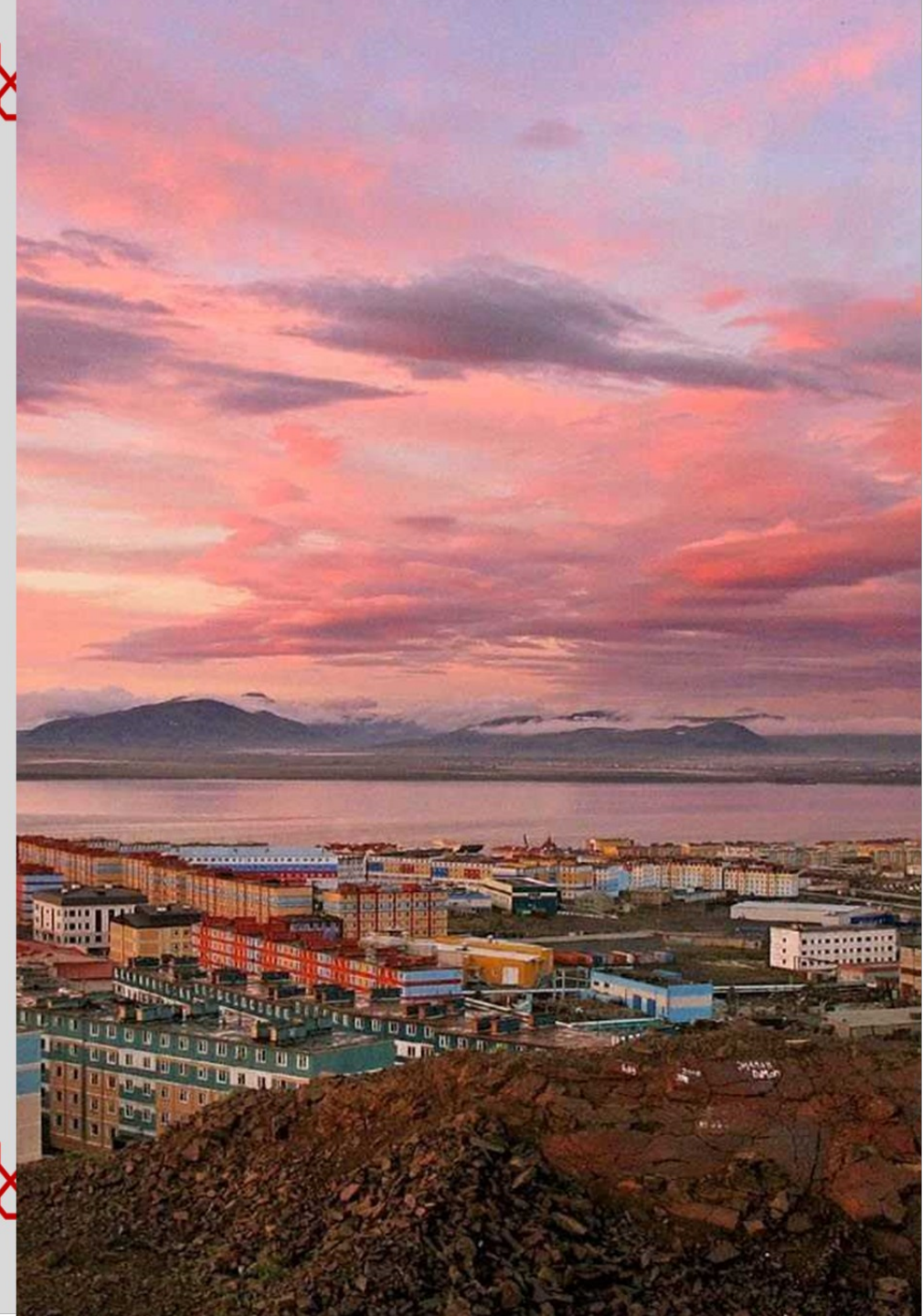


CHUKOTKA AUTONOMOUS OKRUG

The Chukotka Autonomous Okrug is located in the extreme northeast of Russia, partly beyond the Arctic Circle. Area 721.5 thousand km. Population 50.7 thousand people. Average population density 0.1 people/km² (2019). The administrative center is the city of Anadyr (



GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION

The Chukotka Autonomous Okrug occupies the Chukotka Peninsula, the adjacent part of the mainland and a number of islands (Wrangel, Ayon, Ratmanova, etc.). It is washed by the East Siberian and Chukchi Seas in the north and the Bering Sea in the east. The western part of the district is occupied by the mountain systems of the Oloi ridge and Ush - Urekchen; in the central part - the Anyui Range and the Anadyr Plateau; in the east - the Chukotka Plateau; to the south is the Anadyr Lowland, to the southeast is the Koryak Highlands.





SYMBOLS DAY

The flag of the Chukotka Autonomous Okrug is a rectangular cloth of blue color with a white trigon, located base to the staff, with the tip in the center of the cloth. In the center of the white trigon is the symbolism of the Russian flag surrounded by a yellow circle in the form of a circle.

The coat of arms of the Chukotka Autonomous Okrug was adopted on November 27, 2000. It includes the following elements: purple the color of the heraldic shield means the age-old wisdom and calm firmness of character of the northerners, the long polar night that reigns over the Chukchi tundra for most of the year; white the bear is a traditional symbol of the region and reflects the potential strength and power of the autonomous districts; yellow the color in which the symbolic image of the territory is painted symbolizes gold - the main wealth Chukotka; red star - symbol of the North Star.

NATURAL RESOURCES AND CLIMATE

The Chukotka Autonomous Okrug has significant mineral reserves (gold, silver, copper, hard and brown coal, tin, tungsten, mercury, oil, natural gas), which provide the basis for industrial production.

Most of the district's territory is located beyond the Arctic Circle. Therefore, the climate here is harsh, subarctic, on the coasts - maritime, in the interior - continental. The duration of winter is up to 10 months. The average temperature in January is from -15°C to -39°C , in July - from $+5^{\circ}\text{C}$ to $+10^{\circ}\text{C}$. The absolute recorded minimum is -61°C , the absolute maximum is $+34^{\circ}\text{C}$. Precipitation - 200-500 mm per year.



POPULATION

The population of the district, according to Rosstat, is 47,840 people. (2023). The population density is 0.07 people/km² (2023).

Half of the population is Russian, 25% are indigenous Chukchi. The rest are represented by Evens, Chuvash, Eskimos, Koryaks and other small peoples.
